"Joshua told the people, 'Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you.'"— Joshua 3:5

Before Israel ever stepped into the Jordan River, God called them to consecrate themselves. The miracle did not begin with the waters parting—it began in the heart. Consecration means setting ourselves apart for God, removing anything that competes for His place in our lives. Personal holiness doesn't earn God's power, but it prepares us to receive what He longs to do. As we examine our hearts today, we make room for God to move in extraordinary ways.



PRAY: Lord, search my heart and reveal anything that does not honor You. I repent and surrender every area of my life to You. Purify me and prepare me for the amazing works You desire to do. Amen.



REFLECT: What attitudes, habits, or distractions might God be asking you to surrender today as an act of consecration?

Expecting Wonders



"Joshua told the people, 'Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you.'"— Joshua 3:5-7

After consecration came expectation. God reminded Israel that the same God who moved in the past was about to move again. Standing before the Jordan, the people had a choice: focus on the obstacle or trust in God's promise. Faith grows when we remember what God has already done and believe He can do it again. Whatever "Jordan" stands in your way today, God is able to part the waters in His perfect time.



PRAY: Father, open my eyes to see Your power at work. Help me trust You beyond what I can see and strengthen my faith as I wait for Your wonders. Amen..



REFLECT: What situation in your life feels like a "Jordan River," and how can recalling God's past faithfulness help you trust Him today?

United for God's Work



"Joshua told the people, 'Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you.'"— Joshua 3:5

God called Israel to consecrate themselves not just individually, but together as one people. The miracle at the Jordan was experienced in community, not in isolation. Unity creates an atmosphere where God's power flows freely. When God's people walk in humility, forgiveness, and shared purpose, barriers are removed and His presence is made known. Today, God invites us to pursue unity so that His amazing works may be seen among us.



PRAY: Lord, bring unity to Your church. Heal divisions, soften our hearts, and help us walk together in love and humility. May Your power flow through us as one body. Amen.

Positioned for Breakthrough
